In addition, proposed facilities should be located to minimize encumbrance to the corridor so that the railroad will have unrestricted use of its corridor for current and future operations.

Railroad's preferred method of installation under tracks is "**Jack & Bore**" (boring pits not allowed on RR property). If open cut installation is required, applicant will be billed for cost required for Railroad to resurface tracks. Directional Drilling is considered a variance and additional cost will apply for review.

R.J. Corman requires:

All wirelines under the railroad should be encased. All wirelines will be at a minimum depth of 5½' from bottom of rail to top of casing pipe. All wirelines will have a 5' ground cover for areas not under the track. Jack & Bore is the preferred method of installation.

If application is approved, applicant agrees to reimburse the Railroad for any cost incurred by the Railroad incident to installation, maintenance, and/or supervision necessitated by this installation, and further agrees to assume all liability for accidents or injuries which arise as a result of this installation. Applicant will be required to work with Railroad Manager to determine a time for construction that will not interfere with Railroad Operations.

Two (2) <u>letter size</u> prints of a drawing showing plan, elevation section of crossing from field survey, location in respect to milepost and track, width of Railroad's right of way, location and distances to track and adjacent structures affecting crossing, and bore pits.

- (non-refundable) Application & Engineering Review Fee \$ \$2,000.00
- □ Projects requesting a variance will require additional review fees and may require a construction oversite fee.
- □ If your project has a proposed installation directional drill, please contact the Real Estate Department for the required additional review packet. All Directional Drill installations have an additional review fee of \$2,500.00 in addition to the required application fee.

The Railroad Company reviews each project to determine, in its sole discretion, the need for flagmen, inspection services or additional review by outside services. If required, additional fees may be charged for those services.

If you are requesting an Expedited Review and application, please submit an additional \$3,000.00. All other applicable application fees are also due. RJC's typical review window, from application to agreement is 30 days, and Expedited Review window, from application to agreement, is 6 days. Review windows DO NOT include notice to proceed or acquiring proper insurance. Variances do not qualify for Expedited Review.

It is important that your request be complete and accurate as possible to prevent delay or rejection. The application processing time greatly depends on the accuracy of information and the detail of drawings provided. Processing time is normally completed within 30 days. If the project requires a variance approval, site assessment or resources outside our company the timeframes will depend on availability of resources.

Once your application is approved you will be provided a permit/agreement and instructions for scheduling. If your project is approved, estimate at least 30 days prior to the project start for a flagman to be available on site.

WHILE YOUR APPLICATION IS UNDER REVIEW, PLEASE PREPARE FOR THE FOLLOWING:

If approved, there will be an annual License fee required. The amount of the fee will be determined upon completion of application review. Please contact the Real Estate Dept. if you are interested in making a one-time payment in lieu of annual payments.

INSURANCE

If approved, the following Insurance will be required:

- During the continuance of the Agreement, a policy of Public or Commercial Liability Insurance, naming Licensee as insured and covering liability assumed by Licensee and naming Licensor as additional insured. A coverage limit of not less than \$1,000,000.00
 Combined Single Limit per Occurrence for bodily injury liability and property damage liability is required. This should also cover contractual liability during periods of survey, installation and maintenance.
- During the construction phase, a policy of Railroad Protective Liability Insurance naming R.J. Corman Railroad Company as insured with limits of \$2,000,000.00 per Occurrence and \$6,000,000.00 aggregate. Please note R.J. Corman's insurance policy does not provide for the option of adding a rider to its policy as a substitute for applicant's purchase of a policy of Railroad Protective Liability Insurance. Note that Railroad Protective Liability Insurance will require higher limits if your project is near a transit line location.
- Your RJC Agreement number should be included on your certificate. This agreement number will be assigned with application approval.

A Certificate of Insurance will be required before authorization to begin work will be issued.

NO WORK CAN BEGIN UNTIL YOU RECEIVE A WRITTEN NOTICE TO PROCEED.

Entering any railroad right of way or other railroad property without the written permission of the railroad is trespassing and illegal. Violators will be prosecuted. Trespassing puts you, our employees and the public at risk of serious, even fatal injury.

ENTRY PERMITS

Contractor's performing installations will be required to have an Entry Permit. If the Licensee chooses not to be responsible for any and all contractors or subcontractors, then an entry permit is required for all companies completing work in the Railroad Right of way area. These fees are in addition to the application fees above.

FLAGGING

If your project requires a flagger the rate is \$1,200.00 an hour for an 8-hour day. The need for flagging will be determined by the appointed Railroad representative for your area.
